

Skateparks En Barcelona

In its latest exploration of creative subcultures, Zalando Street spotlights the skateboarding scene in Barcelona. Here, local skaters talk about their community that celebrates freedom and authenticity.

MACBA (Museum of Contemporary Art) is undoubtedly the most iconic street skating spot in the city. Its biggest attraction is a massive, long single ledge.

Port Vell

The port has a lot to offer for visitors, from walking tours and shopping to grabbing a bite to eat. The area was once an industrial port, but a large urban renewal project transformed the site into a vibrant leisure and entertainment destination.

Several skateparks have been built in the area, including Mar Bella and MACBA. These parks are great places to practice your skills and have fun with friends. The city is also always building new spots, so check the map before you head out!

Visiting the Port Vell area is a great way to get out of the city and enjoy some fresh air. You can also take a boat trip to see the sights and explore the city's historic seaside treasure. There are also several museums in the area, so you're sure to find something that interests you. Whatever you do, make sure to wear comfortable shoes and sunscreen!

La Barceloneta

As much as the streets of Barcelona are a huge skate park, there are some specific areas that you'll want to head to for a little more privacy. You can find skateparks in the area of Mar Bella (near Parc Esportiu), Port Olimpic, and Nou Barris. The city is also always building new parks, so it's worth checking in with the local skater community to see what's up.

Located near Canyelles L3 underground station, this skatepark features different transitions, ramps and stairs, rails and pyramids. It's a good place for all levels and even hosts a number of different competitions.

This is a big spot that was originally built for the Forum Universal de las Cultures expo. The space has vast ledges and stairs made of metal that are usually waxed and are a great spot for skating. In addition, there is a long granite slappy bank that gets progressively bigger from the front to the back of the plaza.

MACBA

The MACBA, or Museum of Contemporary Art of Barcelona, is one of the city's best skate spots. The large plaza in front of the museum has ledges, stairs, rails, and a wide variety of different obstacles. Skaters from all over the world flock to this spot to show off their skills and have fun.

The location is also great for meeting other skaters and soaking up the vibe. The area is usually full of people, so skaters have to be careful when grinding on ledges or stairs near pedestrians. During the summer, this is a great place to spend a day skating and enjoying the sunshine. The area is a bit crowded, so it's a good idea to arrive early or get there right as the sun starts coming out. You can also check out Les Corts, a small skate park nearby. It has a mix of banks, street obstacles, ledges, manny pads, rail rainbows, and wallrides.

Mar Bella

If you love skating, Marbella's skate park is the perfect spot for you. It is a professional quality skate park that has a lot of different lines, obstacles and angles to practice your tricks.

There is also a big bowl on the side closest to the beach and a street course that includes a few rails, a pole jam, some curbs and mellow banks. This park was designed specifically for young people who love to skateboard, inline skate and BMX.

It is also a great place to have some fun with friends and spend time outdoors. There is a children's area and a nudist section, along with many activities like beach volley, table tennis and basketball. In addition, there are various food and drink kiosks and a cloakroom. You can also rent a boat or book kayak excursions on the sea.
