Even during an interview with a reporter, he said he wanted to take pictures with Abando.

"I was going to go to Korea and watch the KBL game of Abando and other countries' games together. But I'm really grateful and happy that the team of Abando can come and watch the game like this. If I have any wish, my wish is to take a picture with Abando," he said with a smile.

Except for Abando, there are players who have ties to the Philippines in the articles of association. Jamil Wilson, who played in the Philippine League before joining the articles of association. Mr. Raymond already knew about Wilson.

"Jamil Wilson played for a team in Manila and watched all the games back then. It's nice to see you again," Raymond said.
