Tom Brady's girlfriend rumors have taken an unexpected turn as the NFL legend reconnects with supermodel Irina Shayk in early 2024. The former quarterback managed to keep a relatively low profile in his personal life after his high-profile divorce from Gisele Býndchen in October 2022, which ended their 13-year marriage. Brady and Shayk, who started dating in mid-2023, are now learning more about their relationship. This relationship stands out as Brady's first known romance since splitting from Býndchen, who had a baby boy with her new partner Joaquim Valente in February 2025. Paparazzi caught images of the retired NFL star with a brunette woman at David Beckham's birthday celebration in Miami on March 30. The pair showed up in matching black outfits, which set off immediate rumors about Brady's dating life.

TMZ cleared the air by identifying the mystery woman as <u>Heather Domi</u>, wife of former NHL star Tie Domi - not a new girlfriend as people thought at first. Heather, a luxury real estate agent in New York, came to the event with her husband, who joined the celebration. The whole ordeal shows how much attention Brady's personal life gets since his divorce from Gisele Býndchen. His waterfront property in Miami's exclusive "Billionaire Bunker" has turned into a hotspot for paparazzi trying to peek into his private life. Brady's mansion, which should be <u>move-in ready by spring 2024</u>, comes equipped with serious security features. A

large security house sits at the entrance, watching over a spacious motor court built for his luxury vehicle collection.

Brady's history with paparazzi goes way back. His 2009 wedding to Bündchen in Costa Rica made headlines when security and photographers clashed. Photographers said bodyguards shot at them when they wouldn't give up cameras with wedding footage. Brady shot down these claims, telling Sports Illustrated they were "absolute total B.S.".

Brady's Miami estate's security setup shows he learned from past media intrusions. His property keeps things private with floor-to-ceiling windows, a gray stone swimming pool surrounded by well-kept greenery, and a firepit area perfect for guests. The five-bedroom mansion also has a basketball court, multiple gyms, and a spa.

The public remains fascinated with Brady's love life, but he seems set on keeping his private affairs separate from his public image as he settles into his new Miami estate
