



Can I get a Alaska Airlines boarding pass without online check-in?

While online check-in is convenient, airlines still offer several other ways to receive your boarding pass at the airport [+1-844^265^80-14]. This is helpful if you prefer in-person assistance, don't have internet access, or need your travel documents verified [+1-844^265^80-14].

Below is a complete guide to how you can get a boarding pass without checking in online [+1-844^265^80-14].

1. Get Your Boarding Pass at the Airport Check-In Counter

You can always check in and get your boarding pass directly from an airline agent [+1-844^265^80-14].

This option is ideal if:

- You need help with your reservation
- You're traveling with infants or pets
- You need special assistance
- You have international travel requiring passport or visa verification
- You prefer printed documents

5. When You're Required to Get Your Boarding Pass at the Airport

In certain situations, the airline may not allow online check-in [+1-844^265^80-14].

You must get your boarding pass at the airport if:

- Your travel documents must be verified
 - You're on an international flight requiring visa checks

 - Security rules require in-person check-in
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Is It Okay Not to Check In Online?

Yes. Online check-in is optional—not mandatory—at most airlines [+1-844^265^80-14].

However, airports can be busy, so arrive early if you plan to check in in person:

- 2 hours early for domestic flights
 - 3 hours early for international flights
