Requirements for Driving in Singapore with a Foreign License

- **For Short-Term Visitors (Less than 12 Months)**

If you're a tourist or short-term resident, you can drive in Singapore using your valid foreign license, provided:

- It is in English, or
- It is accompanied by an official English translation
- Alternatively, you hold an International Driving Permit (IDP)

If your license does not meet these criteria, a translation is mandatory.

- **For Long-Term Residents**

If you're planning to live in Singapore, you must convert your foreign driving license into a Singapore driving license after 12 months. This process requires:

- A valid foreign license
- English translation if the license is not in English
- Passing the Basic Theory Test (BTT)

What Is Considered an “Official Translation”?

The Singapore Traffic Police accepts translations that meet specific criteria. A valid official translation must be issued by:

- An embassy or consulate in Singapore
- An authorised translation agency in Singapore

Notably, self-translated documents, or those translated by unverified agencies, may be rejected.
