Apply a stain remover or a mixture of dish soap and water to the affected area. Let it sit for about 30 minutes to break down the paint. Then, scrub the stain with a brush or cloth and rinse thoroughly. This way you can remove dried paint from clothes easily. For stubborn stains, you might need to repeat the process or use a commercial paint remover designed for fabrics. Always check the label and test a small area first.
5. **Special Tips for Acrylic Paint:** Acrylic paint can be tricky because it bonds quickly with fabric fibers. If you're thinking about how to get acrylic paint out of clothes, try using a mixture of equal parts white vinegar and water. Soak the stain in this solution and gently scrub.
