How to Calculate GPA: Step-by-Step

If you're using a GPA Calculator or doing it manually, here's the procedure:

- Know the Grading Scale:
 - \circ A = 4.0
 - \circ B = 3.0
 - \circ C = 2.0
 - ∘ D = 1.0
 - \circ F = 0.0
- List Your Grades and Credits:

Note for each class the grade and the number of credit hours (e.g., three credits in a Math subject).

Multiply Grade Points by Credits:

For each course, you must multiply the grade point by the number of credits. Example:

- A (4.0) in a 3-credit course = 12 grade points.
- Add Up the Grade Points and Credits:

Add all the grade points and credits for your courses.

Divide Grade Points by Credits:

Divide your total grade points by the total number of credits to find your GPA.

Example: Calculating GPA Manually

If you're in the following courses:

- Math: A (4.0) in a 3-credit course = 12 grade points
- History: B (3.0) in a 4-credit course = 12 grade points
- Science: C (2.0) in a 3-credit course = 6 grade points

Total grade points = 12 + 12 + 6 = 30 Total credits = 3 + 4 + 3 = 10 GPA = 30 / 10 = 3.0
