



Pawn Shop Jewelry

It is thrilling to obtain a "sneak" in a vintage shop, spa or consignment store that you might not have bought elsewhere at full price. Pawnshops have for decades been a place where people go to save a bit of money (or find some money). In a time where a penny saved is a penny earned, discounted used items are flying off the shelves at locations such as the World Famous Gold & Silver Pawn Shop, whose daily surgeries are dramatized on the History channel series Pawn Stars.

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Some items, such as furniture and tools, are straightforward to purchase, since their condition can usually be assessed using a thorough look-over. A Cartier necklace or a De Beers ring is much more complex than that. Pawnshop owners are jacks-of-all-trades, not specialists in jewelry. While the family-owned establishment on Pawn Stars will hire an appraiser to decide on a reasonable price, there's absolutely no assurance that shops not appearing on national tv will make that attempt. Jewelry pricing goes beyond what the buyer simply thinks the item is worth to them, because so many variables are involved in the investment.

Pawnshops lack the comprehensive understanding that jewelry stores can supply about the actual face value of a bit. Scratches, clouds, and other flaws on a gemstone's surface are detectable to a trained eye using a magnifier. Lacking these tools and a commitment to the jewellery profession, a pawnbroker can miss these imperfections and also pass a VVS1 diamond off as an FL one. (If you don't understand what this means, ask a jeweler.)

The very nature of a pawnshop can result in the transaction of illegal goods. Desperate men and women visit pawnbrokers to find easy money in challenging times. If someone is behind on their rent, they could give up their jewelry into a pawnshop and also be extended a loan that they need to pay off or forfeit the item. All too often, the original source of the bit is somebody else that had been robbed by the loan seeker. If that is true, and it is discovered that the thing has been stolen, researchers can require it be returned to its rightful owner even after a client of this shop has bought it.

Pawnshops aren't the root of all evil; many are run as legitimate businesses. Like every market, the shops vary depending upon the owners and their commitment to serving their clients. If you are looking for real quality jewelry that will last and may even give you a return on investment, taking your business to an actual jewelry store is the ideal choice.
