



Most Memorable Partnerships in Rohit Sharma's Test Career

Rohit Sharma's Test career is a story of resilience, reinvention, and remarkable transformation. From starting as a middle-order hopeful to becoming India's most reliable opener in the latter stages of his red-ball journey, Rohit found ways to rise, adapt, and deliver. And while his individual brilliance is often the highlight, some of his finest moments have come when he shared the crease in partnerships that defined matches and turned the tide for India. Test cricket, after all, is as much about building partnerships as it is about personal milestones—and Rohit has been part of some unforgettable stands.



1. Rohit Sharma and Ajinkya Rahane – 267 vs South Africa, Ranchi, 2019

One of the most iconic partnerships in Rohit's Test career came during the 2019 home series against South Africa. Having been promoted to the opening slot, Rohit was in supreme form, and in the third Test in Ranchi, he and Rahane stitched together a mammoth 267-run partnership. Rohit scored a brilliant 212, his maiden Test double century, while Rahane played a solid hand with a century of his own. It was a masterclass in patience and dominance, as the two Mumbaikars took apart the South African bowling with ease, setting up a series whitewash.

2. Rohit Sharma and KL Rahul – 126 vs England, Lord’s, 2021

Opening the batting in English conditions is never easy, but Rohit and KL Rahul made it look like art during India’s second innings at Lord’s. Against the swinging red duke ball, the pair showed immense discipline and technique, putting on a 126-run stand. Rohit was fluent with his drives and pulls, while Rahul dropped anchor. It was the kind of partnership that doesn’t just show runs—it shows character. This stand laid the foundation for one of India’s most famous overseas Test wins in recent years.

3. Rohit Sharma and Cheteshwar Pujara – 153 vs England, The Oval, 2021

Rohit’s first overseas Test century came at The Oval in 2021, and it was made possible by a gritty 153-run partnership with Cheteshwar Pujara. After conceding a first-innings lead, India needed a strong response in the second innings. Rohit played the aggressor, while Pujara dug in with his trademark patience. Together, they blunted England’s attack and turned the game on its head. Rohit’s century in that innings wasn’t just a personal milestone—it was a turning point in the match.

4. Rohit Sharma and Mayank Agarwal – 317 vs South Africa, Vizag, 2019

In his first outing as a Test opener, Rohit Sharma made a grand statement, and his partnership with Mayank Agarwal in the first Test of the 2019 series against South Africa set the tone. The duo put on a massive 317-run stand—the highest opening partnership for India in over a decade. Both batters scored centuries, with Rohit going on to make 176. It was a partnership full of confidence and flair, and it signaled the beginning of a successful new chapter for Rohit in Tests.

5. Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli – 162 vs West Indies, Mumbai, 2018

While not as high-profile as some of his other partnerships, Rohit’s stand with Kohli against the West Indies in 2018 was a delightful exhibition of class and control. On a flat Wankhede pitch, the two combined for 162 runs, with Rohit scoring 102 and Kohli making 139. The chemistry between the two senior players was evident, as they rotated strike seamlessly and punished loose deliveries. It was one of those partnerships where everything seemed to click.

Throughout his Test career, Rohit Sharma has shown that while his individual flair often takes the spotlight, he thrives just as much when he’s building something with a partner. Whether

grinding through tough conditions or lighting up the scoreboard, Rohit's best has often come when shared. These partnerships are a testament to his evolution as a red-ball player—not just a solo artist, but a team man who knew the value of trust, rhythm, and shared momentum.
