Kratom Legality in New Jersey in 2023: Kratom Consumer Protection Act - Amendments

In June 2023, after several hearings and amendments for bill NJ S3549:

- Kratom vendors must register with the Department of Health and pay an annual fee of \$500
- Kratom products must be labeled with information such as ingredients, net weight, alkaloid content ([mitragynine](#) and [7-hydroxymitragynine](#)), batch number, expiration date, and a warning statement
- Kratom products must be tested by a certified laboratory for contaminants such as heavy metals, pesticides, bacteria, and fungi.
- Kratom products must not contain more than 2% of [7-hydroxymitragynine](#) or any other synthetic alkaloids or substances
- Kratom products must not be sold to anyone under the age of 18
- Kratom vendors must comply with the rules and regulations of the Department of Health and the Attorney General

The law also established a Kratom Advisory Council, composed of representatives from the Department of Health, the Attorney General's Office, the AKA, the kratom industry, and the medical and scientific community. The council is responsible for reviewing and evaluating the safety and efficacy of kratom and making recommendations to the Legislature and the Governor regarding its regulation.

The enactment of the KCPA in New Jersey was celebrated by kratom advocates and consumers as a major victory for kratom rights and access. The law also set an example for other states that are considering regulating or banning kratom in the future.

Kratom Legality in New Jersey in 2022: Kratom Consumer Protection Act Proposed

In January 2022, Assemblywoman Annette Quijano introduced bill NJ S3549, which proposed to regulate the sale and distribution of kratom in New Jersey under the Kratom Consumer Protection Act (KCPA). The KCPA is a model legislation that has been adopted by several states across the country, including Arizona, Georgia, Nevada, Utah, Oregon, Tennessee,

Oklahoma, Colorado, Mississippi, Louisiana, and Florida. The KCPA aims to ensure that kratom products are safe and pure for consumers by setting standards for labeling, testing, packaging, and age restrictions. The KCPA also prohibits the sale of adulterated or synthetic kratom products that contain other substances or higher [concentrations of alkaloids](#) than naturally occurring in the plant. The bill was referred to the Assembly Health Committee for further consideration.

Kratom Legality in New Jersey in 2021: Kratom Remains Legal

As of December 2021, kratom remains legal in New Jersey, as there is no current ban or regulation on its sale or possession. However, there is also no quality control or consumer protection for kratom products in the state. Therefore, it is important for kratom users to be careful and vigilant when buying kratom from local vendors or online sources. It is advisable to look for reputable and reliable vendors who test their products for purity and potency and provide lab results upon request. It is also recommended to avoid buying kratom from gas stations, head shops, or convenience stores, as these places may sell low-quality or adulterated products that could pose health risks.

Kratom Legality in New Jersey in 2020: The Third Attempt to Ban Kratom

In January 2020, Assemblyman Dancer made another attempt to ban kratom by reintroducing the same bill as NJ A2236. The bill was once again referred to the Assembly Law and Public Safety Committee. However, this time, the committee decided to hold a hearing on the bill on March 5th, 2020. The hearing was attended by several kratom advocates and experts, who presented scientific evidence and personal stories in favor of keeping kratom legal. Some of the speakers included Dr. Jack Henningfield, a leading addiction expert and pharmacologist; Mac Haddow, the senior fellow on public policy at the AKA; and C.M. "Mac" Warner, a former U.S. Army Special Forces officer and West Virginia Secretary of State. The committee members listened to the testimonies and asked questions about kratom's benefits and risks. The hearing ended without a vote on the bill.

Kratom Legality in New Jersey in 2018: The Second Attempt to Ban Kratom

In January 2018, Assemblyman Dancer reintroduced the same bill as NJ A3281, with no changes or amendments. The bill was again assigned to the Assembly Law and Public Safety Committee, where it faced strong opposition from kratom advocates and consumers. The American Kratom Association (AKA), a non-profit organization that promotes the safe and responsible use of kratom, launched a petition to keep kratom legal in New Jersey, which gathered over 6,000 signatures. The AKA also organized a rally at the State House Annex in

Trenton, where dozens of kratom supporters voiced their testimonies and experiences with the herb. The bill did not advance out of the committee.

Kratom Legality in New Jersey in 2015: The First Bill to Ban Kratom

In February 2015, Assemblyman Ronald Dancer introduced bill NJ A4431, which aimed to criminalize kratom and its alkaloids, mitragynine and 7-hydroxymitragynine. and make its possession, manufacture, distribution, and marketing a state felony punishable by up to five years in prison and a fine of up to \$25,000. The bill also proposed to add kratom to the list of Schedule I controlled substances, along with heroin, LSD, and ecstasy. The bill was referred to the Assembly Law and Public Safety Committee, but it never received a hearing or a vote.

Kratom Legality in New Jersey in 2014: Legal but Still Under Scrutiny

There were no major events related to the legality of kratom in New Jersey in 2014. However, the FDA continued to warn about the potential risks of kratom, and the DEA continued to raid kratom vendors.

Kratom Legality in New Jersey in 2013: FDA Warnings

In 2013, there were no major events related to the legality of kratom in New Jersey. However, the FDA issued a public safety communication in February 2013, which warned about the potential risks of kratom, including [addiction](#), [liver damage](#), and death.
