### 4. Mitigating Transnational Logistical Vulnerabilities

**Connecting Flights vs. Direct Point-to-Point:** If your group must connect, ensure your first point of entry into

the United States allows at least a **3-hour layover** window. Groups clear customs at their initial point of entry, not their final destination. Baggage must be physically re-checked.

**The Passport Deviation Buffer:** Most airlines mandate that name lists match passport books identically. Build

a strict internal deadline for your travelers 14 days *prior* to the airline's official manifest deadline to

accommodate typos or expired documentation.

**Utilization and Attrition Rules:** Group contracts allow you to drop a certain percentage of your seats (usually

10% to 20%) without financial penalty before a specific cutoff date. Track this date carefully to trim excess

inventory as your group plans crystallize.
