Before you start the construction of your house, the designer should be able to assist you with the necessary planning and construction approvals. Before starting the construction, preliminary room arrangements, window opening sizes, orientation, furniture layouts, and preliminary construction techniques are decided. Spend some time visualizing your family living in the design. Re-examine your present home's analysis. You might want to request that the designer include scaled drawings of the furniture you plan to use in your home that you can print and cut out so you can play around with the layout on the concept designs this aids in visualizing and identifying how your family might live in the house.
