Steps to Remediate PDF for Accessibility



Start with a structured document

Proper document structure, including logical organization, proper formatting, and headings, is crucial for PDF accessibility, preventing the inclusion of unsearchable text or scanned images.

START

Insert ALT text for images

Every image in your PDF must contain alt text descriptions. It is essential for those relying on screen readers to understand the image's context. Write an alt text that is descriptive and concise.



Choose the right styles and Fonts



Use easily readable fonts and styles, avoid decorative ones, maintain a maximum font size of 12 points, and maintain proper color contrast between background and text colors.

Ensure content structuring and tagging



Tags are essential for structuring documents, which allows screen readers to interpret the content accurately.



Create Meaningful Hyperlinks

Keep your hyperlinks descriptive instead of using generic phrases, such as "read more" or "click here." Descriptive links offer easy navigation and offer context to those relying on assistive technologies.



Keep a correct reading order

Ensure logical reading order and appropriate language for screen readers.
