



Mistakes to Avoid in PTE Examination

Errors to Avoid in PTE Exam

- **Fast Isn't Fluent**

Few aspirants think that speaking too fast is fluency. They're wrong! This affects their overall score. When speaking too rapidly, legibility and fluency suffer. Hence, participants should always try to remain with the pace. It should neither be too slow nor fast. Always aim to speak at your average speed and maintain the duration of your speech while giving the PTE speaking mock test.

- **Using Filler Sounds**

Whenever participants think of any word, they try to make sounds like Uhm, aah, etc. This affects your overall examination score. You can use alternatives to these such as, you see, you know etc. Try practising with a template to get used to it more.

- **Don't Overuse Prepositions**

They are overusing prepositions such as about is omitted. It is one of the most common mistakes made by the aspirants. They tend to use this word too often. Due to this mistake, they can lose marks in the [PTE speaking mock test](#).

- **Incorrect use of tenses**

While you're describing things, students often end up using the wrong tenses. For Instance, utilise present continuous tense in place of simple tense. This can lead you to lose marks.

- **Write things without adhering to the word count**

Never choose to exceed the word limit in tasks such as essays and written texts. Stick to your writing pattern of 250-300 words. Writing more or less can affect the PTE speaking mock test score. Always stick to the guidelines of the examination.

- **Never speak in breaks**

Don't speak in breaks while you're giving a speech. This can be acceptable in daily life but not in the PTE academic examination. Always organise your thoughts before you speak. Maintain a slow, steady and average speed so that you get time to organize all your thoughts even before you talk. Also, remember to check the word count not to harm your overall PTE score.

- **Don't use colloquial language**

Never use informal or [casual](#) language. This would cut your marks. Instead, use an academic and formal tone. This would put a great impression on the examiner as well.

- **Don't pause for too long**

Remember that while speaking, if you take a pause for more than three seconds, then the microphone goes off. Anything you say after a pause of three seconds would not be recorded. Hence, make sure to keep this thing in mind always.

- **Don't make false starts, hesitations or repetitions**

Your oral fluency determines your speaking score. Avoid unnecessary false starts and statements, leading to a bad score. Repetitive words should be avoided at all costs. Repeating things would lead to a super bad impression while harming the exam score.

- **Write a single sentence**

The majority of the aspirants lose marks by writing a lot of sentences in the PTE test question types. You can even write a single text and put a full stop. You can also use connectors, but remember only to use one full stop.

- **Wrong Pitch**

Your pitch plays a significant role in your PTE score. Male Candidates should never speak with a low pitch, while females should avoid a high rise.
