

Safest Cars to Drive in 2022



Each year the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety publicizes its list of safest vehicles for the current year. It got <u>formed in 1959</u>, with the three largest car insurance businesses and 80% of the market. What Does Safest Mean?

Each year, the NHTSA lists vehicles it will test for safety. The tests use crash dummies to mimic the injuries that would occur to a human. The NHTSA represents the government's involvement with vehicle safety while driving on public streets and highways.

Other organizations like the <u>IIHS</u> publish independent safety ratings and NHTSA safety ratings. This interaction between a government agency and a private business organization benefits consumers. The safest cars have a list crossover so the same car can be on both lists, facts known by a car accident lawyer. However, the IIHS tests vehicles not on the NHTSA list. These lists matter to drivers who made a purchase based on the lists. These safety ratings are just some of the information used by the car accident lawyer at <u>Robert J.
