

Online Madhyamik Results 2016

Some parents and teachers have expressed concern the no-detention and making Class X board exams optional have eroded the grade of school education. Schools, students and parents have "schooling nearly Class X too easy," said a government official close to your development.

"There is really a thought within the ministry that as an alternative to no-detention policy nearly Madhyamik Result 2016, it could be reduced in a very staggered manner. One from the options being weighed is the fact no detention policy will stay around Class V and examination system will return from then on," the state run cited above said on condition of anonymity.



A second government official declared that though the no-detention policy was taken to reduce stress among students, inside last five-years it has not achieved the specified result. "Many states have suggested which it needs a relook. The ministry is taken this to CABE for a consensus view following which a policy could be devised," another official said.

The HRD ministry may also present the finding of your subcommittee report for the nodetention policy that has been prepared many years back with a group of state education ministers led at that time Haryana education minister Geeta Bhukkal, according on the agenda note with the ministry for your meeting.

The government policy will affect in excess of 190 million pursuing education in primary and upper primary level.

The first government official declared the no-detention policy, the continuous comprehensive

evaluation (CCE) and making the Class X board exams optional needs to be seen in tandem as is also "interconnected".

The RTE Act was passed during the past year and it arrived to force from 1 April 2010. It made education compulsory for young students between the ages of six and 14.

CCE was brought to offset any shortcomings inside no-detention policy. "Continuous evaluation was considered to improve quality however some schools have never understood its merit yet. Like university tutorial system, this was considered to be a remedial education method and cause better learning outcome but which has not happened," said the initial official.



Lalatendu Mahal, a faculty teacher in Hyderabad, declared since RTE got into force, students have stopped taking schooling seriously. "They know nobody will fail them and there is no Class X board exam too. Result: poor learning by students and great deal of pressure about them from Class XI onwards," he stated, adding that ending the no-detention policy and bringing back compulsory <u>PSEB 10th Results</u> exam is going to be positive moves.

Several reports have showed that learning outcome in schools happen to be poor over years.

According to your Programme for International Student Assessment, coordinated because of the Paris-based Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development, India was ranked in the bottom among 74 countries in 2010-11. Similarly, the 2014 Annual Status of Education Report (ASER) by education non-profit Pratham said every second Class V student in rural India can't see the text of an class three levels below. In 2005, when the very first ASER report was published, three outside of five children in Class V made it possible to read a Class II text.
