Results for Science and Commerce Available Here Delhi Private School Dubai hails UAE top scorer in CBSE results

DUBAI // Delhi Private School Dubai is celebrating after learning certainly one of its students is presumed for being among the high scorers from the annual Grade 12 Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) exams inside UAE.

The examination was presented with to CBSE curriculum students in March and is particularly offered in one among three streams: science, commerce and humanities. Results were released completely on Thursday.

For Delhi Private School Dubai (DPSD), this can be a first time among its students has performed so well.

"Somehow or perhaps the other, there were not yet secured our UAE topper," said Rachna Prakash, DPSD headmistress. "We are really proud. It's an incredible sense of achievement and pride and, I mean, we're also at the top of the planet."

Vineet Nair, 17, scored 98.2 per cent inside the science stream 10th Class CBSE Result 2016, making her the presumed top performer inside country.

"I was shocked," said Vineet, a Kerala native who lives in Dubai regarding his parents and twin brother, Visakh. "I was expecting great results, however, not this great."

His mother, Kala, said she expected nothing less from her high-achieving sons.

"They been employed hard, so I expected this."

Although Visakh didn't score all the way to his brother, he still achieved a standard score of 95.2 within the science stream.
