



Antihydrogen's Notes on How To Be a Troll

The algorithm

Step 1: Look for high momentum gainers with the ultimate expectation to either short or, if not possible, to buy low and sell high with high degrees of frequencies.

Step 2: Create a few accounts on Twitter, StockTwits, Yahoo message forums, Advfn, etc. and hunker down.

Step 3: Befriend a few people as a new investor with significant shares (doesn't matter how much, but try to keep it less than \$30k).

Step 4: As soon as the charts shows a negative movement begin using hyperboles like "pos", "garbage", "HAHAHA", "LOLOL", "somebody knows something", "scam", or "crashing".

Step 5: To enhance eliciting negative reactions and seed doubt, spend 10 minutes reading website articles and comments, and keep making plausible sounding tidbits of information until people respond to the doubt. Continue with step 4 as needed.

Step 6: Get out when the movement slows down or stops.

Step 7: If the chart movement goes positive, then protect your credibility by switching to bull stance and claim you never sold or acquired even more. If anyone challenges, claim they are "stupid" or not such a great trader and should quit. Keep trying until users' feelings are hurt or angry so that they won't think clearly.

Step 8: Repeat steps 4 to 7 until credibility is almost exhausted, and introduce another character allocated from step 2.

Step 9: When the stock or people no longer responds, move on to step 1.

Notes:

- Only say entry and exit price after it happens and never before--no historical reputation needed when trolling.
- Rarely say anything positive.
- Don't get sucked into discussing any one topic too deep or your intelligence would get exposed.
- Spam as much as possible because it's your job to shake up more people rather than helping any individual.
